The Page County Board of Supervisors met in session on this 27th day of February 2018, with Jon Herzberg, Chuck Morris, and Alan Armstrong present. On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve the agenda. Present from the public were Kris Grebert, Heidi Carter, Mike Peterson, Angie Dow, Brenda Esaias, and John VanNostrand.

King stated crews ran Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of last week. Sand was brought in and salt has been ordered. Calcium chloride was also delivered. The excavator that tipped over has been taken to the Ziegler shop to be repaired. The Brummett Bridge crews are working.

Carl Sonksen, attorney, met with the board to discuss the weapons policy. House file 2146 was discussed. He discussed the ban on weapons. He discussed the different supervisory orders. Sheriff Palmer joined the meeting.

The safety consultant was discussed. Morris stated he feels we need to move forward with a safety consultant. There will be a conference call next week to discuss billing and services that can be offered.

Alan Ritchie discussed the state autopsies. He discussed the continued increase in cases going to have autopsies.
