The Page County Board of Supervisors met in session on this 21st day of January 2020, with Chuck Morris, Alan Armstrong, and Jon Herzberg present. Present from the public was John VanNostrand.

Angie Dow met with the board to discuss the assignment of a county held tax sale certificate. On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve the assignment of county held tax sale certificate 2011-11013 to the City of Shenandoah.

On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve Bruce Gruber as the new medical investigator.

Kris Grebert met with the board to discuss the dispatch pay scale. The board discussed the pay scale for dispatch and would like the current pay scale followed with increases to be followed according to the current union contract. Discussions will continue after the budget is completed due to the fact the union contract will end June 30th.

King gave the board a roads update. He stated the crews are out burning brush and trees. The crews are hauling sand due to the potential upcoming snowstorm. The crews ran last Friday and Saturday. On G-27 concrete was planned last week. On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve Project BROS-SWAP-CO73(136)-FE-73: Culvert on 290th Street over the middle Tarkio Creek, north of the City of Northboro; the board moved to approve the signing of the title sheet and the SWAP funding agreement.

The board went through the local option sales tax budget, noting no additional changes.

The board met with Brenda Esaias, Recorder, and went through the budget, noting no additional changes.

The board met with Angie Dow, Treasurer, and went through the budget, noting no additional changes.

The board met with Jess Erdman, Public Health, and went through the budget; they will consider moving a part-time position to a full-time position.

The board met with Darin Sunderman, Environmental Health, and went through the budget, noting no additional changes.

The board met with John Schwab, Conservation Director, and went through the budget. Temporary wages were increased \$10,000. Kathy Jordan and Bill Roberts were present during the budget presentation.

The board went through the IT budget, noting no additional changes.

The board met with Melissa Wellhausen, Auditor, and went through the Auditor's budget and the Election budget, noting no additional changes.

The board went through the Board of Supervisor budget, special law enforcement, special investigations, K-9, miscellaneous court ordered services, general relief, human services, integrated road-side management, county farm, medical examiner, district court, REAP, wellness program, bonds, mental health, juvenile court services, drainage, and Shenandoah building, noting no additional changes.
